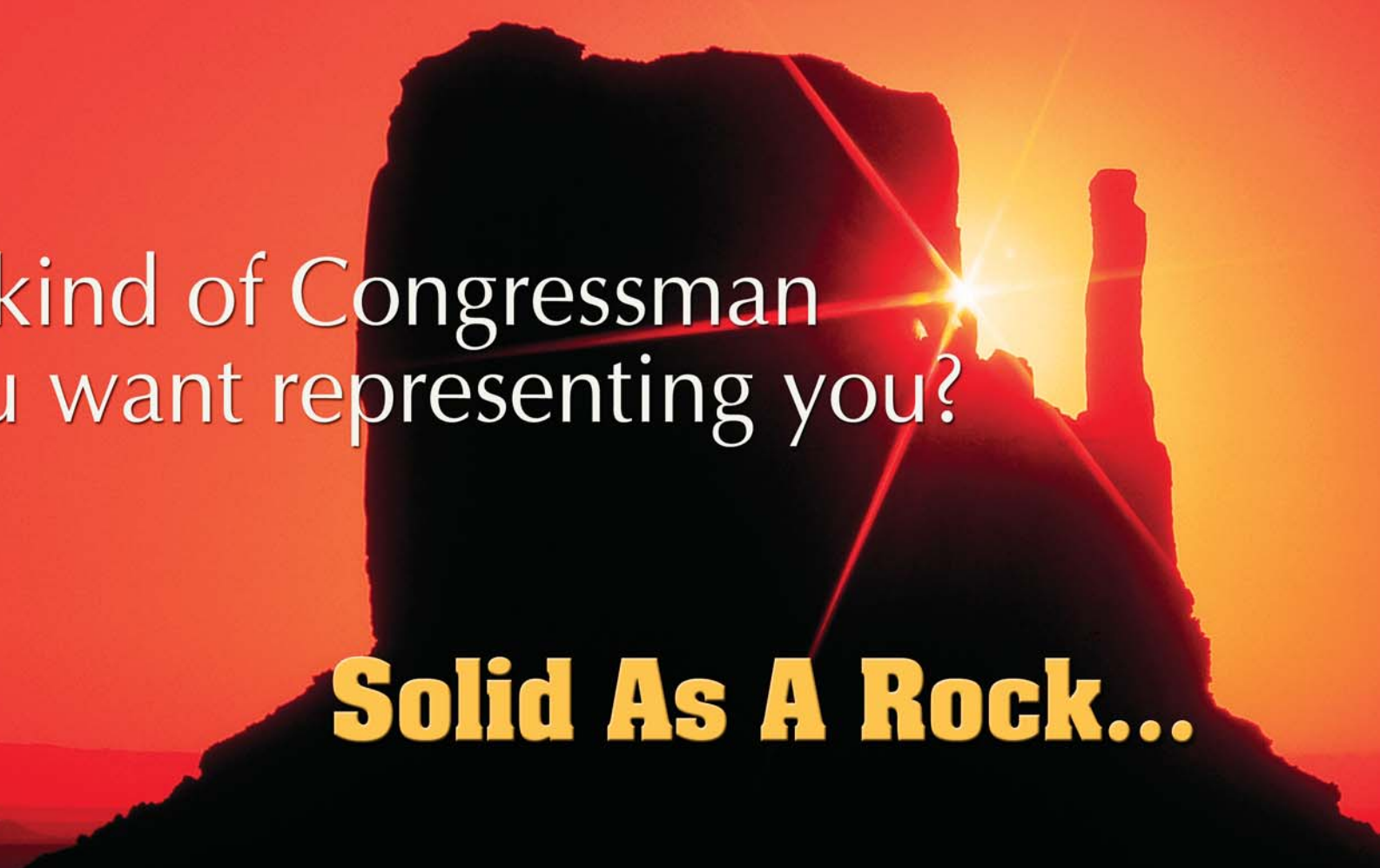

Taxes

FLAKE VOTED TO CUT YOUR TAXES TWICE – voting for two of the largest tax cuts in history. Americans for Tax Reform named Congressman Flake a "Taxpayer Hero", the National Taxpayers Union gave him a 100% rating, and Citizens Against Government Waste called Jeff Flake a "strong beacon of light for taxpayers."

BARNES VOTED TO RAISE YOUR TAXES \$122.5 Million as a member of the Arizona Legislature. Discussing his vote to raise your taxes, Stan Barnes said, "I'm proud of that vote... if you want to know what kind of Congressman I'll be, you think about that vote."

Trust

He did as promised
